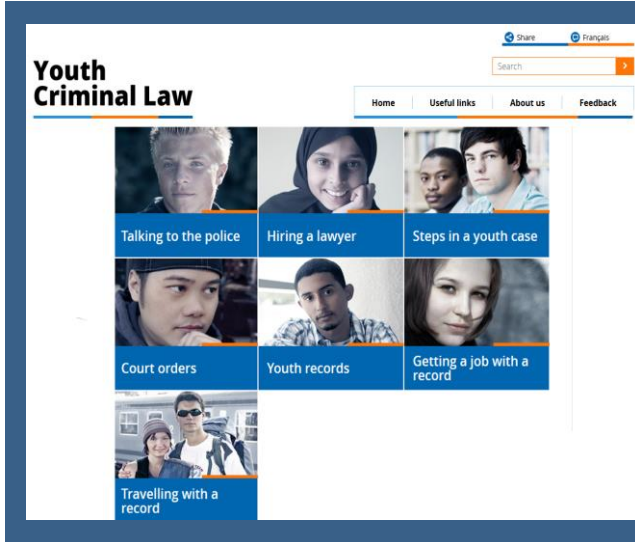




CLEO at a glance

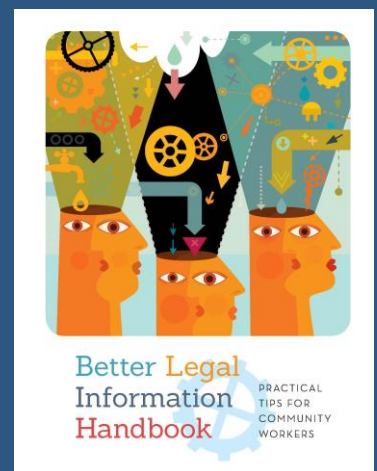
Family law

- 441 resources from 43 organizations available through the Your Legal Rights website
- 49 legal and social services working with family law mapped on Your Legal Rights interactive Services Map

Housing law

- 54 CLEO resources available in print, PDF, HTML, audio and video
- 12 CLEO resources available in 8 languages, including ASL, other than English and French
- 18 CLEO common questions on the Your Legal Rights website
- 280 resources from 39 organizations available through the Your Legal Rights website
- 88 legal and social services working with housing law mapped on Your Legal Rights interactive Services Map
